### CODE OF CONDUCT



1. Delegates are requested to wear the identification cards provided by the Mayo College Girls' School both in committee sessions as well as for social events to ensure a smooth flow of events.
2. The event is designed to be a safe and inclusive space for all cultures and delegates are expected to maintain respectful dialogue.
3. Delegates are advised to take care of their valuables (phones, laptops, chargers, money etc.) and avoid leaving them unattended at any point. Students to take care of their belongings, as the school shall not assume responsibility for any items that may be misplaced.
4. MCGSMUN '26 shall follow UNA-USA Rules of Procedure. Any modification to the Rules of Procedure for specialised committees will be notified to the committee by the Executive Board.
5. Delegates are encouraged to exercise diplomatic courtesy when addressing other delegates, the Executive Board, logistics, teachers, support staff and others assisting in the conference.
6. To ensure that the committee runs on time, delegates are expected to be present in the assigned committee room 10 minutes prior to the beginning of the session.
7. Any unparliamentary sloganeering and disruption of committees will result in disqualification from the awards in the committee.
8. To receive the certificate of participation delegates are expected to attend all the committee sessions. In case of an unavoidable/medical circumstance, the delegate and

the teacher in charge must inform the school authorities and/or the Secretariat about the same.

9. The use of internet and AI platforms is not permitted during committee sessions to ensure authentic discussions. Any instances of active usage will be reported to the respective Executive Board by the committee logistics.

10. Plagiarism in speeches and documentation is highly discouraged.

11. We encourage participants to use the school property, facilities, and resources responsibly, ensuring that they remain in suitable condition.

12. In alignment with the sustainability goals of our conference, we kindly encourage all participants to use pens, pencils, notepads, chit pads, and paper cups judiciously.

13. The conference expects and embraces a welcoming environment where harassment, any kind of bullying (including physical, cyber or verbal bullying) and discrimination are not tolerated.

14. The conference follows a zero-tolerance policy for substance abuse, any violation of this policy will lead to disqualification for the whole delegation from the best delegation award and the disciplinary inquiry on the delegate found to be in violation of the policy.
